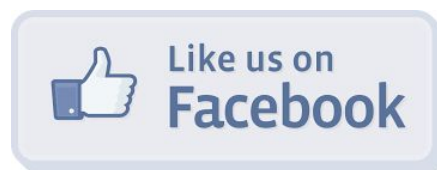

This church actively follows Jesus' command to love God, love one's neighbour and to care for all people. Our clergy and parishioners regularly visit the sick, home-bound, and the dying. We care for the poor and needy through service and charitable giving, through our Opportunity Shop run in partnership with the local Catholic and Uniting churches, and by supporting the work of Anglicare, The Brotherhood of St. Laurence and The Anglican Board of Mission. Our clergy regularly baptise new members of the church, preside at weddings and care for the grieving through our funeral ministry. The First Lesson Acts 9.36-43

³⁶Now in Joppa there was a disciple whose name was Tabitha, which in Greek is Dorcas. She was devoted to good works and acts of charity. ³⁷At that time she became ill and died. When they had washed her, they laid her in a room upstairs. ³⁸Since Lydda was near Joppa, the disciples, who heard that Peter was there, sent two men to him with the request, 'Please come to us without delay.' ³⁹So Peter got up and went with them; and when he arrived, they took him to the room upstairs. All the widows stood beside him, weeping and showing tunics and other clothing that Dorcas had made while she was with them. ⁴⁰Peter put all of them outside, and then he knelt down and prayed. He turned to the body and said, 'Tabitha, get up.' Then she opened her eyes, and seeing Peter, she sat up. ⁴¹He gave her his hand and helped her up. Then calling the saints and widows, he showed her to be alive. ⁴²This became known throughout Joppa, and many believed in the Lord. ⁴³Meanwhile he stayed in Joppa for some time with a certain Simon, a tanner.

⁹After this I looked, and there was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, robed in white, with palm branches in their hands. ¹⁰They cried out in a loud voice, saying, 'Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne, and to the Lamb!' ¹¹And all the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshipped God, ¹²singing, 'Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honour and power and might be to our God for ever and ever! Amen.' ¹³Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, 'Who are these, robed in white, and where have they come from?' ¹⁴I said to him, 'Sir, you are the one that knows.' Then he said to me, 'These are they who have come out of the great ordeal; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. ¹⁵For this reason they are before the throne of God, and worship him day and night within his temple, and the one who is seated on the throne will shelter them. ¹⁶They will hunger no more, and thirst no more; the sun will not strike them, nor any scorching heat; ¹⁷for the Lamb at the centre of the throne will be their shepherd, and he will guide them to springs of the water of life, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes.'

The Holy Gospel according to St. John, Chapter 10, commencing at verse twenty two. **Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**

²²At that time the festival of the Dedication took place in Jerusalem. It was winter, ²³and Jesus was walking in the temple, in the portico of Solomon. ²⁴So the Jews gathered around him and said to him, 'How long will you keep us in suspense? If you are the Messiah, tell us plainly.' ²⁵Jesus answered, 'I have told you, and you do not believe. The works that I do in my Father's name testify to me; ²⁶but you do not believe, because you do not belong to my sheep. ²⁷My sheep hear my voice. I know them, and they follow me. ²⁸I give them eternal life, and they will never perish. No one will snatch them out of my hand. ²⁹What my Father has given me is greater than all else, and no one can snatch it out of the Father's hand. ³⁰The Father and I are one.'

Notre-Dame Paris Concert On Friday May 17 at 6.30pm a fund-raising concert will be held in St Patrick's Cathedral, East Melbourne to raise funds for the organs of Notre-Dame de Paris. The Choir Organ has been damaged beyond repair while the west-end Grand Orgue has escaped the flames, but will require restoration and complete cleaning. Parts of this instrument go back to the Baroque era and it is very fortunate that it remains free of serious damage.

All admission collected goes to Notre-Dame. Prominent Melbourne musicians will perform French organ music in support of the French nation and the Cathedral's famous musicians; also giving thanks for the amount left un-damaged.

Parish Stewardship 2018 - 2019: Update

We are now mid-way through our Stewardship for the period of 2018 - 2019, which is an opportune time to review where we stand in relation to our stewardship of the parish. Interestingly, our current parish recorder, Helen Ballantyne, who has held this position since October 2014, has informed me that in her time of recording this is **our best year to date** with anticipated pledges for the year 2018 -2019 on track to be close to \$150,000. When we consider for the year 2014 - 2015 this was in the vicinity of \$100,000, and pledge income for the years 2014, 15, 16 and 17 was also received from All Saints Kooyong, this is a most pleasing result. Many thanks to all of you who contribute to our church in this fashion.

Nevertheless we cannot afford to be complacent! To give you a few facts:

- Our annual stipend and salary expenditure for Peter, Elizabeth, Sally and Chris is a modest \$300,000.
- The estimated maintenance and cleaning costs alone for our properties is \$55,000.
- We thus have to rely on investments and rental incomes to make up the rest of our \$550,000 annual budget.
- We have approximately 180 households on our parish roll of which 66 (a third) are pledging - imagine how much better off we could be if more parishioners were committed to pledging? If you do not do so already, please give this your prayerful consideration.

I remain very positive about our future as we are blessed with parishioners who support, volunteer and are committed to the spiritual, financial and fellowship growth of St John's.
