This is a wonderful and historic church, founded in 1859, a faithful Christian presence for over 160 years! We are part of the Anglican Church of Australia and a member of the global Anglican Communion, comprised of 80 million people.

Regular services of worship are held each Sunday at 8am and 10am, and Wednesday at 7pm. All are welcome. Services are followed by times of fellowship over food and drinks to which everyone is also welcome.

This church actively follows Jesus' command to love God, love one's neighbour and to care for all people. Our clergy and parishioners regularly visit the sick, home-bound, and the dying. We care for the poor and needy through service and charitable giving, through our Opportunity Shop run in partnership with the local Catholic and Uniting churches, and by supporting the work of Anglicare, The Brotherhood of St. Laurence and The Anglican Board of Mission. Our clergy regularly baptise new members of the church, preside at weddings and care for the grieving through our funeral ministry. If you would like to give of your time and talents in the service of others, please also contact the church and we will gladly welcome your contribution.

¹²So now, O Israel, what does the Lord your God require of you? ¹And so, brothers and sisters, I could not speak to you as spiritual people, but rather as people of the flesh, as infants in Christ. ²I fed you with milk, not solid food, for you were not ready for solid food. Even now you are still not ready, ³for you are still of the flesh. For as long as there is jealousy and quarrelling among you, are you not of the flesh, and behaving according to human inclinations? ⁴For when one says, 'I belong to Paul', and another, 'I belong to Apollos', are you not merely human? ⁵What then is Apollos? What is Paul? Servants through whom you came to believe, as the Lord assigned to each. ⁶I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth. ⁷So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth. ⁸The one who plants and the one who waters have a common purpose, and each will receive wages according to the labour of each. ⁹For we are God's servants, working together; you are God's field, God's building. The Gospel Matthew 5.21-37

The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, Chapter 5, commencing at verse twenty one. **Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.**

²¹'You have heard that it was said to those of ancient times, "You shall not murder"; and "whoever murders shall be liable to judgement." ²²But I say to you that if you are angry with a brother or sister, you will be liable to judgement; and if you insult a brother or sister, you will be liable to the council; and if you say, "You fool", you will be liable to the hell of fire. ²³So when you are offering your gift at the altar, if you remember that your brother or sister has something against you, ²⁴leave your gift there before the altar and go; first be reconciled to your brother or sister, and then come and offer your gift. ²⁵Come to terms quickly with your accuser while you are on the way to court with him, or your accuser may hand you over to the judge, and the judge to the guard, and you will be thrown into prison. ²⁶Truly I tell you, you will never get out until you have paid the last penny. ²⁷ You have heard that it was said, "You shall not commit adultery."²⁸ But I say to you that everyone who looks at a woman with lust has already committed adultery with her in his heart. ²⁹If your right eye causes you to sin, tear it out and throw it away; it is better for you to lose one of your members than for your whole body to be thrown into hell.[h] ³⁰And if your right hand causes you to sin, cut it off and throw it away; it is better for you to lose one of your members than for your whole body to go into hell.³¹"It was also said, 'Whoever divorces his wife, let him give her a certificate of divorce.' ³²But I say to you that anyone who divorces his wife, except on the ground of unchastity, causes her to commit adultery; and whoever marries a divorced woman commits adultery. ³³"Again, you have heard that it was said to those of ancient times, 'You shall not swear falsely, but carry out the vows you have made to the Lord.' ³⁴But I say to you, Do not swear at all, either by heaven, for it is the throne of God, ³⁵or by the earth, for it is his footstool, or by Jerusalem, for it is the city of the great King.³⁶And do not swear by your head, for you cannot make one hair white or black. ³⁷Let your word be 'Yes, Yes' or 'No, No'; anything more than this comes from the evil one. For the Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ.

Helping those Affected by the Bushfires

St. John's is currently supporting those affected by the bushfires in a number of different ways. Here are several ways YOU can also support those in need at this critical time:

Operation Angel

St John's is a drop-off point by *Operation Angel*, an Australian humanitarian organisation founded by Jacqueline Pascarl. During the National Bushfire Emergency, they will be collating emergency hygiene packs for firefighters on the front line, as well as evacuees. They need donations, please. There is a tub in the Narthex to receive donations or they can be dropped off at the Parish Office during the week. The following are needed:

Each basic kit should contain:

1. Small Shampoo (Hotel size are acceptable); 2. Toothbrush & toothpaste 3. Small soap or body wash; 4. Small Deodorant; 5. Comb; 6. *Please place inside a plastic ziplock bag* - approx 30 cm x 25 cm minimum size.

<u>Female specific kits:</u> All of the above, plus, 7. Tampons or sanitary napkins; 8. Hair elastics. Small treat (like one of those 'gift with purchase' lipsticks you got at Christmas but will never use!) optional.

<u>Firefighter specific kit.</u> These will be delivered upcountry to brigades and staging posts and used by frontliners when they come off the fire fronts for a quick nap and a shower when water is available. Please include all of the above items, plus (with or without Feminine sanitary products - but keep in mind, many CFA are female). 9. Eye Drops (their vision suffers from grit and smoke etc); 10. Clean face washer (water is limited & from experience we know firefighters want to scrape grime off their faces - we are avoiding disposables at this point due to adding fuel to fires literally); 11. Clean hand towel (at a pinch, they are enough to dry off body after a quick shower); 12. Disposable razor; 13. Metal spoons and forks. (Firefighters have noted that they can't eat on the go without implements!!!) 14. Small Can of Tuna - (a small tuna tin may be stored in a pocket and scoffed in the fire truck); 15. Small chocolates or sweets - must be in wrappers. You might like to include a personal thank you note to a firefighter in this pack.

We also welcome gift cards by post: (so we can purchase eye drops and toiletries for firefighters) Coles, Woolworths, Chemist Warehouse.
